# About the Midlands Local Food Collaborative

The Midlands Local Food Collaborative (MLFC) was formed in 2012 as a partnership between local government, academic, and non-profit organizations whose common goal was to promote a vibrant and sustainable local food system in the eight-county region known as the SC Midlands. The working group now includes participants from eighteen federal, state, local, academic, and non-profit organizations who meet regularly to coordinate regional food system efforts.

**Mission:** The MLFC's mission is to cultivate a sustainable local food system, foster land stewardship, and increase equitable food access in the Midlands by:

- Engaging and educating the community about food system issues
- Strengthening the local food economy through infrastructure developments in coordination with regional and state efforts
- Advancing policies in support of local food systems and organizing stakeholders around these issues
- Increasing access to healthy food while creating small farmer opportunity
- Increasing sustainable food production through education, technical and financial assistance

# About the SC New and Beginning Farmer Program

The South Carolina New and Beginning Farmer Program (SCNBFP) is focused on enabling new, beginning, and emerging farmers to be successful, productive, and innovative members of their local agricultural community by providing them with the tools, knowledge and skills necessary to be successful entrepreneurs, sound business managers, exemplary stewards of the natural environment, and successful marketers of the unique products they create. Most importantly, the SCNBFP seeks to develop individuals who have a sense of pride and enjoy a quality of life as a result of their investment and participation in the industry of SC agriculture.

Any legal resident of SC who is just beginning farming or who has actively farmed for fewer than 10 consecutive years is eligible to apply for the SCNBFP. This cohort-based, agribusiness training program runs from November through May of each year, and applications open online each June. Please visit our website at <u>www.scnewfarmer.org</u> for more information.

The SCNBFP is a signature program of Clemson Cooperative Extension – Agribusiness, working in collaboration with dozens of statewide entities on programming development and delivery. Since its inception in 2010, more than 300 aspiring and emerging farmers have graduated from the core program, while hundreds of additional SC farmers are reached through SCNBFP regional workshops and the Resource Rodeo each year. The program also supports three annual farm tours, on-farm internships, Annie's Project, and an Alumni Association.

The SCNBFP is currently funded primarily through a USDA-NIFA Beginning Farmer Rancher Development grant (2017-2019), with additional resources provided by Clemson University and many invaluable friends and supporters.
