COLLECTIONS AND MILLAGE SERVICES

- Collections
 - \$28,000,000/yr. (Curbside \$20.68 \$26.00 per customer/month)(Backyard \$40.32 \$60.38 per customer/month). Collections consist of 8 service areas distributed amongst 4 Contractors.

Millage

- MSW Landfill Disposal Cost \$3,140,000/yr.
- County C&D Landfill Operation \$2,000,000/yr.
- County Drop Centers Operation \$1,350,000/yr.
- Capital Equipment and Projects \$1,000,000/yr.
- County C&D Landfill Closeout \$840,000/yr.
- Management \$1,200,000/yr.
- Special Services \$1,100,000/yr.



CPI EFFECT ON CURBSIDE COLLECTIONS

- All contracts use Consumer Price Index for rate adjustments
 - CY21 CPI added 1.4% to the contracts or about \$500,000
 - CY22 CPI is 7.0%, or a \$2,500,000 increase in costs.
 - \$3,000,000 more in contract rates since the last rate increase.
- March year to year CPI has continued to rise to 8.5%

- Backyard Service (enhanced service)-631.21 (Proposed curbside rate x 1.8 as per ordinance) \$631.03
- Disability Backyard Service-323.70 (Current rate increased by 8.3%) \$350.57
- C&D Disposal @ Richland County Landfill-\$25.00 per ton (Waste must originate in RC) 4.16% increase
- Yard/Land Clearing Debris/Dirt-\$25.00 per ton
- Brown Goods/Bulk Items-\$25.00 per ton
- Metal and Appliances-\$25.00 per ton
- Mattress/Box Spring N/C for Richland County Residents (Limit 2 per day. Mattress + box spring are 1)

- Residential Mulch- County residents receive mulch at no charge. Resident self-load. Landfill only
- Commercial Mulch-\$14.00 per ton, Landfill only.
- Residential Latex Paint, N/C for Richland County residents. (Up to 5 cans of any size per day)
- Commercial Latex Paint \$1.00 per/lb.



CONTINUAL IMPROVEMENTS

- Automated collection trucks
 - Eliminate the Rear Load Requirement in the contract.
 - One employee versus three for normal collections
 - Safer operation without two employees in the street
 - Yard waste collection may require a roll cart
 - Piloting requires all late model roll carts on the route(s). Replacement roll carts will be required.
- Drop Centers
 - Reduce Illegal Dumping
 - Ability to take mattresses and be Full Service
 - Locate closer to the population

RECOMMENDATION SUMMARY

- Update the SWR Ordinance (done)
- Seek annual Council approval for the SWR Rates and Fees
- New Contract Terms (underway)
 - New penalties based on the Hauler Report Card
 - Contract time from 5 year to 3 year with two one-year extensions
 - Eliminate rear load truck requirement
 - Eliminate fuel markup
- Move contract area lines for poor performance (one is planned)
- Increase staffing at Solid Waste & Recycling (per budget book)
