Description: After three years of experimentation with cover crops and limited tillage in organic vegetable production, City Roots owners Robbie and Eric McClam and soil health researcher Dr. Buz Kloot have a wealth of experience to share with growers and natural resource professionals. Learn how the McClams have used cover crops to maintain soil nutrient levels without the use of additional fertilizers while removing more than 20,000 pounds of produce annually from a 1.5 acre tract. Discuss cover crop selection, establishment and termination methods, and equipment selection in an organic system; and hear first-hand accounts of the trials and successes the McClams have faced as they reduce tillage. Leave with a better understanding of how organic vegetable growers can better manage their farms' soils.
