- 2. Create a design that illustrates the importance of habitats.
 - Include the words "Home is Where the Habitat is" in the poster design.
 - The recommended paper size is 11" x 17". Posters in any size 8.5" x 11" or larger are accepted.
 - Use markers, crayons, colored pencils, paint, or other flat media to make it colorful!
- 3. Attach a completed entry form to the back of your poster. Submit your poster to the Richland Soil and Water Conservation District by Friday, April II, 2025. Contest winners will receive cash prizes!
