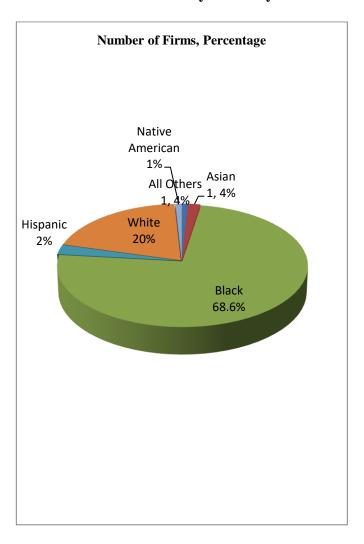

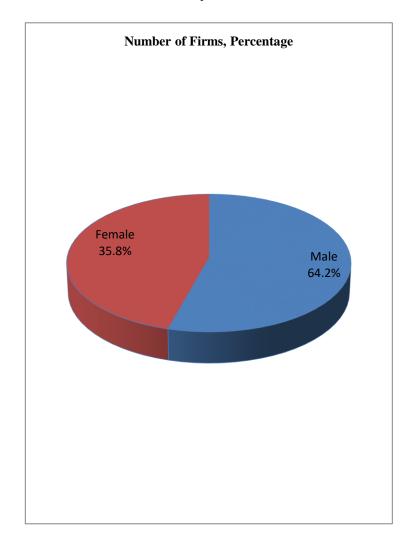

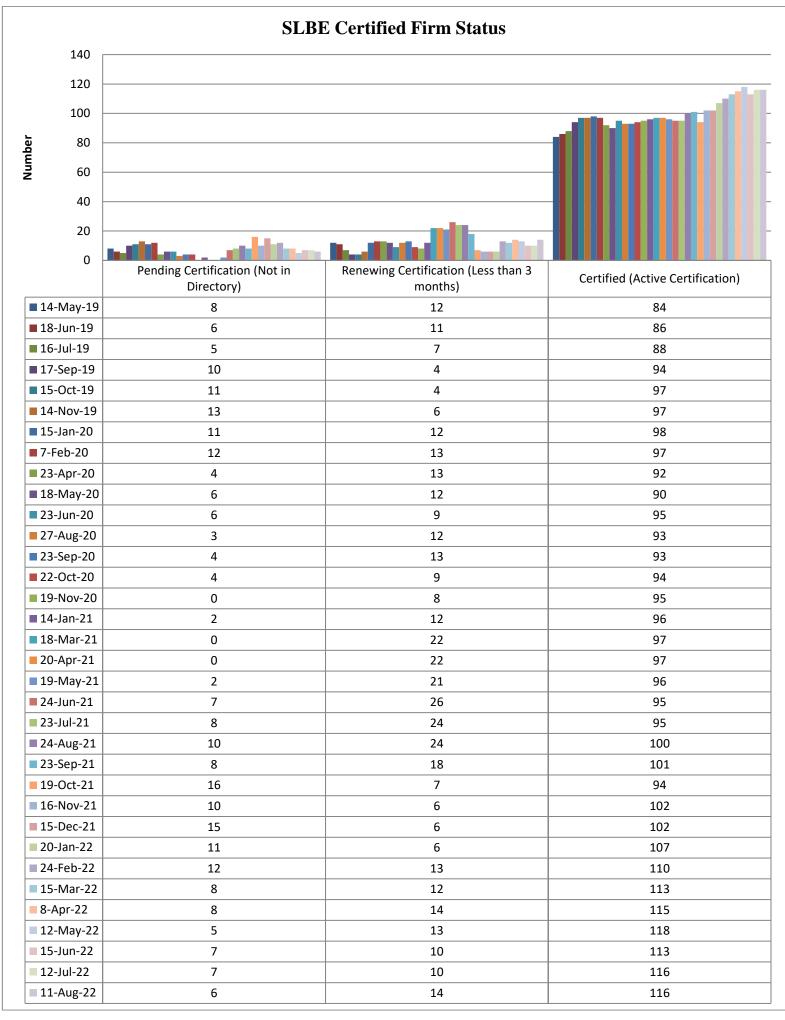

#### **Upcoming Committee\Council Items**

#### **Pre-Construction Update**

- Alpine Rd. Sidewalk County's DPW & Land Development approved sediment/erosion control.
   SCDOT's LPA/DBE requirements is to be verified. Expect to receive ATP for Construction from SCDOT. OET is in final stages of preparing final bid documents for advertisement.
- Atlas Rd. Widening Preliminary Construction Plans submitted to SCDOT and CSX. Following
  approval from both organizations, Final Construction Plans will be developed for construction
  advertisement. Other tasks include finalizing waterline relocations with City of Columbia and other
  minor utility items.
- <u>Bluff Rd. Widening Phase 2</u> The June public input meeting resulted in changes that the OET is working on preparing a revised cost estimate.
- <u>Blythewood Rd. Widening</u> Right of way negotiations are ongoing for the remaining properties. Final
  plans and bid documents are scheduled to be completed and submitted to county personnel by late
  August 2022.
- <u>Blythewood Rd. Area Improvements</u> The County will set up a meeting with the Town of Blythewood
  to discuss a change in termini, due the SCDOT claiming ownership of all of McNulty Street, except for
  the portion between Boney Road and the County Road that runs between Pope –Davis Tire and
  Bojangles.
- <u>Broad River Rd. Corridor NIP</u> The OET has begun work on surveying the site and performing traffic studies. Preliminary Plans are approximately 95% complete and ROW Plans are approximately 39%.
- Broad River Rd. Widening 30% Preliminary Plans are under development. Transportation is
  developing cost estimates to leave the 54" waterline in place with protection and to fully relocate
  waterline. Once completed, SCDOT to make decision on our request to leave the 54" waterline in place.
- <u>Bull\Elmwood Intersection</u> The project was advertise as of June 8, 2022 and the advertisement closed on or about July 18, 2022. The bids came in too high. The County setup a meeting with the lowest

bidder to negotiate cost with in an accept range.

- Crane Creek NIP Design for phases 2 and 3 continues.
  - Phase 2 includes new sidewalks along Blue Ridge Terrace, Heyward Brockington Rd, and Crane Church Road
  - Phase 3 includes new sidewalks along Dakota Dr. Seagull Ln., Roberson St., and Lincolnshire North Dr.
- Crane Creek Greenway The underpass option was rejected by City of Columbia (previously rejected by Norfolk Southern Railroad) as the proposed tracks would cause significant maintenance concerns of the tunnel and the sump pump. The option of crossing over the tracks further north, where a gradual ramp with landings could lead to an overhead and connect on the other side to a high point was also a concern to the City due to lack of ADA accessibility as well as the infrastructure that would be required to provide accessibility in this location. There is a proposal to continue the track north along the river, cross I-20, and connect to the proposed alignment of the Palmetto Trail. This could also provide more feasible connectivity to the neighborhoods north of I-20 (Denny Terrace). OET will make assessment on this.

### <u>Decker\Woodfield NIP</u> –

- O Brookfield Rd. Sidewalk\Chatsworth Connector SCDOT has provided comments on the final construction plans, and the OET has addressed comments and resubmitted to SCDOT. A maintenance agreement between the County and RCRC will need to be executed in order for RCRC to take over permanent maintenance of the Connector. This portion of the NIP will also have intersection pedestrian improvements along Decker Blvd. added to it, which will include work at the intersection of Decker Blvd. with O'Neil Ct, Brookfield Rd, Faraway Dr., and Percival Rd.
- Hunt Club Rd The OET is finalizing 30% plans.
- Garners Ferry\Harmon Intersection Pre-Construction and utility coordination meetings held.
   Construction is scheduled to begin August 22, 2022.
- <u>Gills Creek Greenway</u> Transportation has launched consultant to develop greenway plans between Fort Jackson Blvd and Mikel Lane. The finalizing of the termini was confirmed following multiple scope evaluations.
- <u>Lower Richland Blvd. Widening</u> The OET is working on finalizing preliminary plans.
- <u>Percival Rd. Sidewalk</u> Final updates to Preliminary Construction Plans. Other action items include coordination with local utilities to address conflicts.
- <u>Pineview Rd. Widening</u> The County received comments from SCDOT on 30% preliminary plans. The OET is working a response to SCDOT's comments. The County will submit the response to SCDOT

- after receiving and reviewing them.
- <u>Polo Rd. Widening</u> The OET has submitted 30% plans to SCDOT for review. OET to submit Scope of Work for ROW, utility coordination, and design services during construction.
- Resurfacing Package S Pre-bid held on July 26, 2022. Q/A provided to vendors. Deadline to submit questions on August 8, 2022. Deadline to submit bids August 18, 2022.
- Resurfacing Package T Cost estimate, quantities, project manual, and required documents submitted to Procurement. Pre-bid scheduled for August 23, 2022.
- <u>Screaming Eagle\Percival Intersection</u> Construction was awarded to C.R. Jackson, Inc.
- <u>Southeast Richland Neighborhood Project (SERN) Phase 2 Extension of sidewalk along Rabbit Run</u> Road from Garners Park Road to Trotter Road, recently approved by Council.
- <u>Smith\Rocky Branch Greenway</u> The City completed the review of the 30% structural plans and ROW plans. The City provided a detail for the handrailing. The OET will address the City's comments and proceed to the 90% plans.
- <u>Spears Creek Church Road Widening</u>- The OET is waiting for final approval from SCDOT on the preliminary plans. Preliminary utility coordination has begun.
- <u>Sunset Dr. Sidewalk</u> Final Construction Plans were resubmitted to SCDOT on June 21, 2022, we have received comments for SCDOT and have responded to comments.
- <u>Trenholm\Newcastle NIP</u> The OET is working to complete preliminary plans with changes..
- <u>Dirt Road Design Evaluation</u>- Transportation has launched plan to work with consultants on previously dropped dirt road paving projects to evaluate each dirt road to determine those that can be moved to construction. Goals is to evaluate in excess of 50 dirt roads.

#### **Construction Update**

- <u>Dirt Road Package K- Construction is substantially complete.</u>
  - o Robert James Rd., Rocky Rd., Barkley Rd., South Dr.
- <u>Dirt Road Package L</u> Base course installation underway on Dogwood Shores Lane and Wider Road.
   Coordination completed with construction of adjacent dam to avoid damages to our roads.
- <u>Dirt Road Package M</u> Includes the following roads: Bow String Rd., Maggie Hipp Rd., Rosa Dowdy Rd., and Tall Oaks Dr. Base course installed on Bow String Rd and rough grading underway on Tall Oaks Drive.
- <u>Dirt Road Package N</u>- Advertised for construction. Roads include Summer Haven Drive, Vallenga
   Drive and Cornell Adams Run. Bid Opening date is August 12, 2022
- <u>Innovista Phase II</u>- Approximately 90% complete. Shade structure still needs to be manufactured and installed and the Devine and Gadsden railroad crossings need to be closed. The City still needs to

petition the court for the two closures. The bridge opening is expected to occur mid-November.

- <u>North Main Street</u> The intersection with Monticello Rd. work is scheduled to resume on September (Labor Day week).
- Resurfacing Package R- Approximately 95% complete. Final walk through to be scheduled soon.
- Three Rivers Greenway Ph. 1B Construction is complete, contractor is working to finalize as-builts.

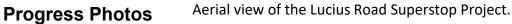
# **Project Summary**

The Lucius Road Superstop project site encompasses over 4.65 acres, which is now approximately 60% physically and 48% financially completed. The general contractor has cleared and grubbed the entire project site except for removal of 1,500 cubic yards of unsuitable material. This issue is being handled by Davis and Floyd, who has contacted several agencies soliciting assistance in taking this material for their own personal use. As of this monthly progress report, Cherokee has invoiced the project for the sum of \$558,137.65, which equals 55% of the overall contract budget.

Due to unapproved change request #005, construction activities were suspended at the project site for three (3) workdays until an alternative option was presented to CMTRA, which included change request #006, with scope of work for hauling 1,200 cubic yards of engineering material. This material would be used to bring the site up to grade elevation and prepare the site for pouring concrete.

From an overall project progress perspective, all the underground storm water utilities have been installed, including underground electrical rough — ins, curbs, and gutters that have been installed in Tier #1 and #2 areas. The sidewalks have been held up due to SCDHEC manpower staffing to approve the Notice of Intent (NOI) permit which was issued in June. This delay has caused a potential impact to the project completion date of the Lucius Road Superstop project.

Finally, the Lucius Road Superstop project is progressing sufficiently even though the project has been delayed for numerous reasons and is on schedule as per Cherokee's contract completion date of October 2022.

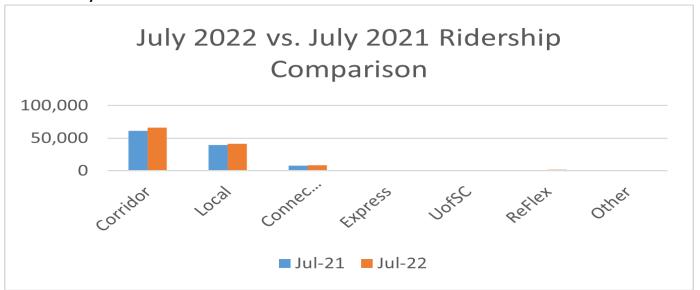

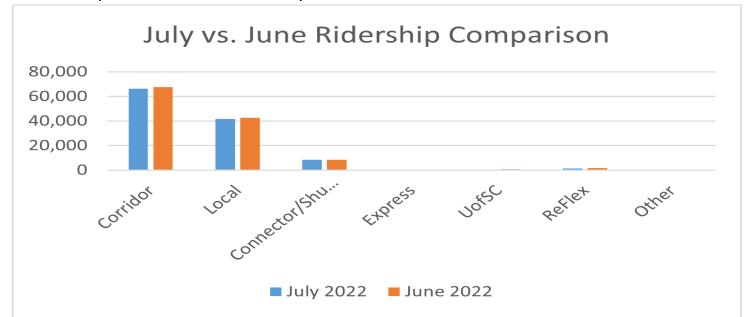
