

LUCIUS ROAD SUPERSTOP

Project Status @ November 2022

A.



- As of month end, the Lucius Road project is 90% physically complete.
- Through the month of November, the Lucius Road project is 87% financially complete.

Project Summary

The Lucius Road Superstop project has begun to transition from an evergreen project of trees and grass into a concrete parking facility that will accommodate sixteen (16) bus spaces and twelve (12) personal parking vehicles. In addition, this project encompasses a 24,000 square foot bus training facility to accommodate the COMET contractors to train their CDL licenses. This facility will also provide a total of eight (8) bus shelters, eighteen (18) parking lights, and twelve (12) security cameras.

The general contractor has poured over 1,500 cubic yards of concrete over the entire 4.28 acres of property within the last three months of the project. The only other remaining activity to be completed is landscaping.

Lastly, we are fully anticipating that the Lucius Road Superstop project will be functional and operational by the first week of December 2022.

Transportation Update – December 19, 2022

General Information

- An offer has been sent out for a new Project Manager.

Upcoming Committee\Council Items

• Blythewood Road Widening Award of Construction

Pre-Construction Update

- <u>Alpine Rd. Sidewalk</u> Working on the bid documents for the project. Prepare and submit LPA DBE documentations to SCDOT in order to receive ATP for construction. Received approval from City of Columbia for utility relocation, however partial payments of line items such as fire hydrants need to be clarified. Working on incorporating City of Columbia's standards and special provisions into the Project Manual.
- <u>Atlas Rd. Widening</u> Preliminary Construction Plans comments received from SCDOT and CSX.
 Consultant is updating plans per comments from both organizations. Transportation will obtain final two
 City of Columbia Gravity Sewer Easement that the City was unable to obtain.
- <u>Bluff Rd. Widening Phase 2</u> The OET has been approved to move forward with the reduced scope limiting the construction of sidewalks to only specific areas and no shared use paths. Resurfacing will be completed as previously approved.
- <u>Blythewood Rd. Area Improvements</u> The County proposed changing to SCDOT for meeting the WB
 -62 requirement in the curve for McNulty Street. The County and OET are awaiting a response from SCDOT, so the OET can continue the design process.
- <u>Broad River Rd. Corridor NIP</u> Preliminary Plans are approximately 95% complete and work has started on the ROW plans 39%. Preliminary plans submitted to the SCDOT for review on 8/23/22. Comments received back from the SCDOT 11/28/22; we are working on responses.
- <u>Broad River Rd. Widening</u> 60% Right of Way plans are under development. Request to leave 54" waterline is under review by SCDOT.
- <u>Crane Creek NIP</u> Design for phases 2 and 3 continues.
 - Phase 2 includes new sidewalks along Blue Ridge Terrace, Heyward Brockington Rd, and Crane Church Road
 - Phase 3 includes new sidewalks along Dakota Dr. Seagull Ln., Roberson St., and Lincolnshire North Dr.
- <u>Crane Creek Greenway</u> A revised route along the river has been proposed for development by Richland County. Environmental sub-consultant has delineated the sensitive areas along the route. OET is scheduled to perform the field survey work so the plans can be finalized.

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OET is working on the flood modeling but for what its worth the entire area will be inundated during a 100-year storm but they need to insure there are no adverse impacts to the bridge. OET has been asked to consult with the Palmetto Trail Foundation to coordinate the efforts to be more in line with the conceptual plan of the Palmetto Trail. Need to further investigate the cost of an additional pedestrian crossing over Crane Creek.

- <u>Dirt Road Design Evaluation</u>- Transportation has launched plan to work with consultants on previously dropped dirt road paving projects to evaluate each dirt road to determine those that can be moved to construction. 60 dirt roads are under evaluation
 - <u>Dirt Road Paving Years 3 & 4</u> Evaluating 34 unpaved roads that were dropped and developing a plan to get additional dirt road paving packages issued for construction in Spring 2023.
- o <u>Decker\Woodfield NIP</u> -
 - <u>Brookfield Rd. Sidewalk\Chatsworth Connector</u> SCDOT has provided comments on the final construction plans, and the OET has addressed comments and resubmitted to SCDOT. A maintenance agreement between the County and RCRC will need to be executed in order for RCRC to take over permanent maintenance of the Connector. This portion of the NIP will also have intersection pedestrian improvements along Decker Blvd. added to it, which will include work at the intersection of Decker Blvd. with O'Neil Ct, Brookfield Rd, Faraway Dr., and Percival Rd.
 - <u>Hunt Club Rd</u> The OET is finalizing 90% plans; plans submitted to SCDOT for approval. Public Information Meeting was held virtually on December 12th.
- <u>Gills Creek Greenway</u> 60% Right-of-Way plans are under development by consultant. Transportation is working with Midlands Technical College to extend section of boardwalk onto their property.
- <u>Lower Richland Blvd. Widening</u> Hydraulic design is underway. Preliminary Right of Way plans have been submitted to SCDOT on 11/10/2022. Preparing for a public information meeting on January 19, 2023. Finalizing SUE report. Displays for the public meeting are being developed. Finalize SUE. Schedule Right of Way Design Review meeting with SCDOT and Richland County. Conduct Public Information Meeting.
- <u>Percival Rd. Sidewalk</u> Final updates to Preliminary Construction Plans per updated SCDOT comments.
 Other action items include coordination with local utilities to address conflicts. Transportation working with remaining property owner to obtain required permission to encroach.
- <u>Pineview Rd. Widening</u> The OET is currently working on the 60% Right of Way plans. The OET will submit them for review on or about February 2023. The County will begin ROW Acquisition on or about March 2023.
- <u>Polo Rd. Widening</u> Received comments back from SCDOT on 30% Plans and are addressing. Moving into the 70% Design Plan Phase. The SCDOT took no exception to the Preliminary Boring Location Plan prepared by F&ME submitted for review on 10/10/22.

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- <u>Polo Rd. Greenway</u> Scope and Fee have been negotiated. Expect to have everything finalized and a NTP issued by 1/2/2023.
- <u>Shop Rd. Widening</u> –. Working on updating 65% design plans based off of a change in the typical section. Need to coordinate with the OET about another Public Information Meeting with changes in typical section. Working on fees for SOM with additional tasks as well as for the additional rework for the roadway and drainage design. Continuing to update roadway and drainage design per new changes in typical section. Negotiate scope and fee for new SOM for roadway and bridge as well as new tasks that include Utility Coordination, Water and Sewer Relocation Design, and Phase II ESA.65% preliminary right of way plans to be submitted to SCDOT in January 2023.
- Southeast Richland Neighborhood Project (SERN) Phase 2 OET is working on cost estimate and design.
- <u>Smith\Rocky Branch Greenway</u> The OET submitted the permit request for approval. After the permit is approved, the OET will submit the 90% Plans and the County will proceed with ROW Acquisition and Certification.
- <u>Spears Creek Church Road Widening</u>- 70% ROW Plans have been completed by Holt Engineering. Plans have been reviewed and submitted to SCDOT along with the QA/QC Checklist for review and approval on 10/7/2022. Beginning Utility Relocation Coordination with City of Columbia and others. This may take a while to complete due to the number of affected utilities in the area and the limited space for relocation.
- <u>Sunset Dr. Sidewalk</u> Construction Plans resubmitted to SCDOT for approval on 9/26/22. Received comments back from SCDOT 11/30/22; working on responses.
- <u>Trenholm\Newcastle NIP</u> The OET is working to complete preliminary plan with changes.

Construction Update

- <u>Blythewood Rd. Widening</u> Bids were received and are being evaluated.
- <u>Bull\Elmwood Intersection</u> The County held the pre-construction meeting on November 14, 2022 and issued the Notice to Proceed. Construction is scheduled to start in January 2023.
- <u>Dirt Road Package M</u> Includes the following roads: Bow String Rd., Maggie Hipp Rd., Rosa Dowdy Rd., and Tall Oaks Dr. Bow String has been paved. Tall Oaks force main installed. Maggie Hipp Road and Rosa Dowdy Ln construction underway.
- <u>Dirt Road Package N</u> Pre-construction meeting held. Notice to Proceed is January 2, 2023. Roads include Summer Haven Drive, Vallenga Drive and Cornell Adams Run.
- <u>Garners Ferry\Harmon Intersection</u> Construction has begun and the gas line has been relocated as per the utility drawings. Segra has mobilized and we are waiting for AT&T to mobilize.

- <u>Innovista Phase II</u>- The project is 100% Completed. We held a successful Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on December 07, 2022. The contractor is currently working on the railroad closures for Devine Street and Gadsden Street.
- <u>North Main Street</u> Construction work on North Main Street, removing of old, deteriorated concrete pavement and placement of base course has been completed. Leveling and final paving will continue.
- <u>Resurfacing Package R</u>- Approximately 95% complete. Final walk performed. Contractor to fix minor deficiencies.
- <u>Resurfacing Package S</u> Pre-construction conference held on 11/22/2022 at 10AM. Construction should begin early January 2023.
- <u>Resurfacing Package T</u> Lowest responsible bidder was announced by Procurement Dept. Palmetto Corp was awarded the contract and it was approved by Transportation ad-hoc and County council. Preconstruction conference is scheduled for January 3, 2023.
- <u>Screaming Eagle</u>/<u>Percival Intersection</u> Grading work has commenced, drainage pipe is being installed along driveways; waiting for AT&T to perform relocates.
- <u>Three Rivers Greenway</u> Ph. 1B Construction is complete, contractor is working to finalize as-builts.
