LUCIUS ROAD SUPERSTOP

Project Summary

CENTRAL MIDLANDS REGIONAL TRANSIT AUTHORITY
COLUMBIA, SOUTH CAROLINA

The Lucius Road Superstop project, as of March 3, 2023, is considered substantially completed to accommodate sixteen (16) bus spaces and twelve (12) personal parking vehicles. In addition, this project encompasses a 24,000 square foot superstop bus training facility to support the COMET contractors and trainees in acquiring their CDL licenses. This facility now has the provisions to accommodate a total of eight (8) bus shelters, eighteen (18) parking lights, fourteen (14) security cameras and twelve (12) pedestrian vehicle parking spaces, and completion of landscaping, security fencing, security cameras, and the installation of the water meter for landscaping. With all these amenities that have been addressed we can deem this project contractual completed.

The original budget for the project was approved for \$1,565,760; however, with scope changes, the current contract value is now \$1,831,616.69.



Pre-Construction Updates

- Alpine Rd. Sidewalk Awaiting a response regarding LBA DBE documentation submitted on 2/9/2023 to SCDOT in order to receive ATP for construction
- Broad River Rd. Corridor NIP Preliminary Plans are approximately 95% complete, and work has started on the ROW plans 39%. Preliminary plans received back from SCDOT 11/28/22. We will be sending a response back to SCDOT.
- <u>Crane Creek Greenway</u> OET is expected to survey the new route in the coming month (pending on river conditions, water is still too high). The location of a new bridge over Crane Creek should still need to be located. The new pedestrian bridge over Crane Creek will be added to the drawings. For the new bridge, we need to evaluate the flood model to make sure it is not causing a rise in the flood elevation. Getting the plans ready for permits by the end of March 2023.
- Decker\Woodfield NIP
 - <u>Brookfield Rd. Sidewalk\Chatsworth</u> Connector SCDOT has provided comments on the final construction plans, and the OET has addressed comments and resubmitted them to SCDOT. A maintenance agreement between the County and RCRC will need to be executed in order for RCRC to take over permanent maintenance of the Connector. This portion of the NIP will also have intersection pedestrian improvements along Decker Blvd. added to it, which will include work at the intersection of Decker Blvd. with O'Neil Ct, Brookfield Rd, Faraway Dr., and Percival Rd.
 - Hunt Club Rd OET is finalizing 90% of plans; plans have been submitted to SCDOT for approval.
- <u>Kelly Mill Rd Widening-</u> OET is continuing to work on a scope and fee for the project; once we have agreed on the scope of the project, the OET will begin the design process.
- Pineview Rd. Widening 70% of Plans were submitted to SCDOT for review on 3/8/23.

- Smith\Rocky Branch Greenway The County and the OET are currently planning a Public Information Meeting. Once scheduled, the public will be notified of the time, date, and location. The OET submitted the permit request for approval. After the permit is approved, the OET will submit the 90% Plans, and the County will proceed with ROW Acquisition and Certification. The county approved the ROW agreement, which was received from Norfolk Southern, and submitted the PO to finance. The County is waiting for another PE agreement from CSX.
- <u>Sunset Dr. Sidewalk</u> SCDOT has returned Construction Plans with comments; OET to address comments.
 Plans were received back from SCDOT for approval on 11/30/22; the comment response was returned to SCDOT on 1/13/23.

Pre- Construction Update (no change since last TPAC)

- <u>Atlas Rd. Widening</u> Transportation will obtain the final two City of Columbia Gravity Sewer Easements.
 Transportation final approval coordination with CSX is underway.
- Bluff Rd. Widening Phase 2 –70% of the plans were submitted to SCDOT on 12/21/22 for review.
- <u>Blythewood Rd. Area Improvements</u> The County and OET received a response from SCDOT for meeting the WB -62 requirement in the curve for McNulty Street. The OET is currently working with the County to review the commits from SCDOT and will provide a response prior to continuing the design process.
- <u>Broad River Rd. Widening</u> 60% Right of Way plans under development. The Project will relocate the City of Columbia 54" waterline. OET is updating the design.
- Crane Creek NIP Design for phases 2 and 3 continues.
 - Phase 2 includes new sidewalks along Blue Ridge Terrace, Heyward Brockington Rd, and Crane Church Road.
 - o Phase 3 includes new sidewalks along Dakota Dr. Seagull Ln., Roberson St., and Lincolnshire North Dr.
- <u>Dirt Road Design Evaluation</u>- Transportation has launched a plan to work with consultants on previously dropped dirt road paving projects to evaluate each dirt road to determine those that can be moved to construction.
- <u>Gills Creek Greenway</u> 60% of Right-of-Way plans are under development by the consultant. Midlands Technical College agreed to the next steps to extend a section of the boardwalk onto their property.

- <u>Percival Rd. Sidewalk</u> Construction Plans under review by SCDOT. The legal department is working with the remaining property owner to acquire the necessary ROW.
- <u>Polo Rd. Widening</u> Received comments back from SCDOT on 30% Plans, and Cox and Dinkins are addressing them. Moving into the 70% Design Plan Phase.
- Polo Rd. Greenway Site investigations and surveying to begin 2/23/23.

- Shop Rd. Widening Working on updates to design and drainage based on the new typical section. Another
 Public Information Meeting will be expected at the time of the preliminary Right of Way submission to SCDOT.
- Southeast Richland Neighborhood Project (SERN) Phase 2 Surveying complete and beginning the design phase.
- Spears Creek Church Road Widening- Received 70% of plan review comments from SCDOT on 1/18/23, and Holt Consulting is addressing them.
- Trenholm\Newcastle NIP The OET is working on completing the preliminary plan with changes

Construction Updates

- o <u>Blythewood Rd. Widening</u> The preconstruction conference was held on March 15th, and the project schedule from the contractor has been received. Clearing and grubbing activities are to begin next week, with construction activities to follow in two weeks.
- o <u>Bull\Elmwood Intersection</u> The contractor has completed about 32% of the construction. Clearing and grubbing are completed. They have also removed and replaced the existing pavement, curbing, concrete and concrete sidewalk and installed pedestrian ramps near the Bull Street District portion of the project. The County reviewed the change order, executed and submitted it for approval. The changes encountered in the field were not addressed during the design.
- o <u>Garners Ferry\Harmon Intersection</u> Construction continues, and the gas line and water line have been relocated as per the utility drawings. The contractor is currently forming foundations for strain poles.
- o <u>Innovista Phase II</u>- This project is currently in close out phase.
- o North Main Street Final inspection upcoming within a few weeks. The project is substantially complete.
- o Resurfacing Package S Construction began on 1/3/23 and continues to progress.
- o Resurfacing Package T Construction began on 2/1/2023 and continues to progress.

 Screaming Eagle\Percival Intersection This project has been awarded, and construction activities have commenced; the contractor is currently tracking in slopes and grading the subgrade for the roadway
