









What is the Neighborhood Matching Grant?

The Neighborhood Matching Grant (NMG) is a grant that provides neighborhood organizations and associations funds to improve their neighborhood.

Neighborhood organizations and associations must provide a match for the awarded grant amount.

A match is equal to volunteer hours, charitable donations, or another grant(s).



Project Categories

Neighborhood Projects must fulfill at least one of these four categories

What kinds of projects are eligible?



Eligible Projects

- Neighborhood Dinner with guest speaker
- Community Newsletters
- Neighborhood website
- Membership recruitment drives
- Neighborhood entrance sign
- Student recognition programs
- Community garden
- National Night Out
- Street light installation

Ineligible Projects

- Flower/tree plantings in common areas
- Operating budget expenses
- Purchasing computers or software materials
- Printing on personal computers
- Home repairs for personal property
- Honorariums
- Mailboxes for only part of community
- Guest speaker (cannot be paid with grant)



Who can apply?

Eligible Applicants

- Any neighborhood based resident association in Richland County or City of Columbia
- Homeowners Associations, Property Owner Associations or Neighborhood Associations
- Association must be open to anyone that lives in the neighborhood (renters & owners)

Ineligible Applicants

- Individuals
- County-wide organizations
- Religious organizations
- Public agencies
- Social groups

Neighborhood organizations may partner with these groups



Application Checklist

Must submit everything below with application



One completed and signed application

• Including: project description, budget sheet, and income sources



In-Kind Donation Letter (if applicable)



Neighborhood By-Laws



IRS W9 Form (latest)



Official Vendor Quotes for each project

 Quotes must be no older than 30 days on vendor letterhead



Copy of most recent neighborhood association's bank statement

Keep a copy of the entire application for your records!



The Process Steps



PROJECT PLANNING

• Discuss potential projects with your neighborhood

COMPLETE AND SUBMIT APPLICATION BY DEADLINE

•Signed and completed with all supporting documentation

APPLICATION REVIEW BY GRANT COMMITTEE AND DECISION BY COUNTY COUNCIL

RECEIVE AWARD LETTER

•Award letters will be sent out in July

COMPLETE AND SUBMIT FORMS IF AWARDED

- •Check Request Form
 - Allow 30 days for processing check request


SIGN AGREEMENT FORM, PICK UP CHECK & EXPEND FUNDS FOR PROJECT



Types of Matches



In-kind Donations Match

Donated professional services (ex: photographer)



Volunteer Hours Match

Each volunteer hour is equivalent to \$10 in match (100 volunteer hours=\$1,000 match)



Cash Match

Via grant amount and neighborhood funding

Grant Limit: \$1,500.00

Amount Awarded: \$1,500.00

Total Projects Cost: \$1,500.00



Project 1 total cost: \$450


\$450 in food

Match: 45 volunteer hours (45 x \$10 = \$450



Project 3 total cost: \$300

Match: \$50 in kind donations \$100 another grant, \$150 neighborhood funds.







\$100 in food

\$100 in supplies

Match: \$50 in-kind donation, 15 volunteer hours (15 x 10= \$150)



Project 4 total cost: \$550

\$550 in supplies

Match: \$550 in neighborhood

funds



Grant Limit: \$1,500.00

Amount Awarded: \$1,500.00

Total Project Cost: \$3,500.00



The Match

- \$250 in-kind donations
- \$250 another grant
- \$1,500 neighborhood funds
 - 25 volunteer hours (\$250)

Match EQUAL: \$2,250

Must match awarded amount or greater

How to ensure your projects get approved:



- **Clear description of projects (preferably typed)**
 - **Quality of the project**
 - **✓** Practical & Realistic goals
 - **✓** Neighborhood participation & contribution
 - **Sommunity** need for the project

Return to NIP after completing the project.
